What is **BIBFRAME 100?**

Initial focus on creating a body of BIBFRAME data

- BIBFRAME ontology
- Data editor
- Semantic system
- Three year Pilot
 - Initially 50 catalogers then 100, but always double keying into MARC <u>and</u> BIBFRAME systems
- So BIBFRAME 100 = BIBFRAME 100%
 - All catalogers keying into BIBFRAME system and not double keying to MARC
 - Caveat can probably only get to around 90% this year

For BIBFRAME 100 needed ...

More robust system – "completed"

- Moved from onsite to cloud
- Updated version of software platform (MarkLogic)
- Merger and update of application software (ID and BFDB)
- New editor "completed"
 - Contractor and experienced Pilot catalogers designed editor functionality
 - New editor programmed, in use
- BIBFRAME data distribution system "under development"
 - Completion target December 2021

For BIBFRAME 100 need ...

MARC to/from BIBFRAME data conversions

- MARC to BIBFRAME since 2012 (current version 1.6)
- BIBFRAME to MARC since 2020 (current version 1.0)
- Issues
 - MARC contains many unused or no longer used elements
 - Different MARC-based Integrated Library Systems (ILS) depend on different elements frim MARC
 - The two conversions are essentially locked together so need to be updated at the same time

MARC in the BIBFRAME landscape

- Internal legacy subsystems may be MARC-based
- MARC records may be supplied by book and other resource vendors
- Cooperative programs with MARC partners
- Copy cataloging from MARC sites
- Sharing the BIBFRAME descriptions with MARC colleagues

Looking forward to next chapters ...

- Using the BIBFRAME RDF to enhance end user searching
 - LC currently looking at enhanced search for CATALOGERS
 - Contractor working directly with Pilot catalogers
- Community agreed MARC simplification
- Convergence of BIBFRAME RDF shapes in **data exchange**
- Authorities
- Identifiers

But meanwhile ...

- Sweden has had an advance BIBFRAME system in production for over 2 years
- SHARE-VDE is rapidly developing new components
- **Stanford** and the **LD4 partners** are moving toward production
- OCLC is poised to load BIBFRAME data from SVDE
